### Critical Illness Insurance

<b>Coverage Options</b>		
<b>Employee</b>	<b>\$10,000 or \$20,000</b>	Coverage is guaranteed provided you are actively at work. <sup>1</sup>
<b>Spouse/Domestic Partner<sup>2*</sup></b>	<b>50% of the employee's Initial Benefit</b>	Coverage is guaranteed provided the employee is actively at work and the spouse/domestic partner is not subject to a medical restriction as set forth on the enrollment form and in the Certificate. <sup>1</sup>
<b>Dependent Child(ren)<sup>3*</sup></b>	<b>25% of the employee's Initial Benefit</b>	Coverage is guaranteed provided the employee is actively at work and the dependent is not subject to a medical restriction as set forth on the enrollment form and in the Certificate. <sup>1</sup>

### Benefit Payment

Your **Initial Benefit** provides a lump-sum cash payment upon the first verified diagnosis of a Covered Condition. Your plan pays a Recurrence Benefit<sup>4</sup> for the following Covered Conditions: Heart Attack<sup>6</sup>, Stroke<sup>7</sup>, Coronary Artery Bypass Graft<sup>8</sup>, Full Benefit Cancer<sup>5</sup>, Partial Benefit Cancer<sup>5</sup>. A Recurrence Benefit is only available if an Initial Benefit has been paid for the Covered Condition. There is a Benefit Suspension Period between Recurrences. Initial Benefits and Recurrence Benefits will be paid until the Total Benefit Amount has been reached.

The maximum amount that you can receive through your Critical Illness Insurance plan is called the **Total Benefit** and is 3 times the amount of your Initial Benefit. This means that you can receive multiple Initial Benefit and Recurrence Benefit payments until you reach the maximum of 300% or \$30,000 or \$60,000.

Please refer to the table below for the percentage benefit amount for each Covered Condition.

## Critical Illness Insurance

### 22 Listed Conditions

MetLife Critical Illness Insurance will pay 25% of the Initial Benefit Amount when a covered person has a verified diagnosis of one of the 22 Listed Conditions. A Covered Person may only receive one payment for one Listed Condition in his/her lifetime. The Listed Conditions are Addison's disease (adrenal hypofunction); amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (Lou Gehrig's disease); cerebrospinal meningitis (bacterial); cerebral palsy; cystic fibrosis; diphtheria; encephalitis; Huntington's disease (Huntington's chorea); Legionnaire's disease; malaria; multiple sclerosis (definitive diagnosis); muscular dystrophy; myasthenia gravis; necrotizing fasciitis; osteomyelitis; poliomyelitis; rabies; sickle cell anemia (excluding sickle cell trait); systemic lupus erythematosus (SLE); systemic sclerosis (scleroderma); tetanus; and tuberculosis.

### Example of Initial & Recurrence Benefit Payments

The example below illustrates an employee who elected an Initial Benefit of \$10,000 and has a Total Benefit of 3 times the Initial Benefit Amount or \$30,000.

Illness – Covered Condition	Payment	Total Benefit Remaining
Heart Attack — first verified diagnosis	Initial Benefit payment of \$10,000 or 100%	\$20,000
Heart Attack — second verified diagnosis, two years later	Recurrence Benefit payment of \$5,000 or 50%	\$15,000
Kidney Failure — first verified diagnosis, three years later	Initial Benefit payment of \$10,000 or 100%	\$5,000

This example is for illustrative purposes only. The MetLife Critical Illness Insurance Policy and Certificate are the governing documents with respect to all matters of insurance, including coverage for specific illnesses. The specific facts of each claim must be evaluated in conjunction with the provisions of the applicable Policy and Certificate to determine coverage in each individual case.

In most states there is a pre-existing condition limitation. If advice, treatment or care was sought, recommended, prescribed or received during the twelve months prior to the effective date of coverage, we will not pay benefits if the covered condition occurs during the first twelve months of coverage. The preexisting condition limitation does not apply to Occupational HIV, heart attack or stroke.

### Supplemental Benefits

MetLife provides coverage for the Supplemental Benefits listed below. This coverage would be in addition to the Total Benefit Amount payable for the previously mentioned Covered Conditions.

#### Health Screening Benefit<sup>12</sup>

MetLife will provide an annual benefit of \$50 per calendar year for taking one of the eligible screening/prevention measures. MetLife will pay only one health screening benefit per Covered Person, defined in the certificate, per calendar year.

**A.** Coverage is paid through payroll deduction.

### Q. Will my rates increase?

A. Your premium is based on your Issue Age, meaning your initial rate is based on your age at the time your coverage becomes effective and your rates will not increase due to age.<sup>13</sup>

### Q. If I Leave the Company, Can I Keep My Coverage?<sup>14</sup>

A. Under certain circumstances, you can take your coverage with you if you leave. You must make a request in writing within a specified period after you leave your employer. You must also continue to pay premiums to keep the coverage in force.

We will not pay a Recurrence Benefit for either a Full Benefit Cancer or a Partial Benefit Cancer unless the Covered Person has not had symptoms of or been treated for the Full Benefit Cancer or Partial Benefit Cancer for which we paid an Initial Benefit during the Treatment Free Period.—

<sup>6</sup> The Heart Attack Covered Condition pays a benefit for the occurrence of a myocardial infarction, subject to the terms of the certificate. A myocardial infarction does not include sudden cardiac arrest.

In most states, we will not pay a Major Organ Transplant benefit if a covered person is placed on the organ transplant list prior to coverage taking effect and subsequently undergoes a transplant procedure for the same organ while coverage is in effect. Covered organs may vary by state; refer to the Certificate for details.

After a covered condition occurs, there is a benefit suspension period during which benefits will not be paid for a recurrence, except in the case of individuals covered under a New York certificate. MetLife's Issue Age CII is guaranteed renewable, and may include a Benefit Reduction Due to Age provision. Premium rates for MetLife's Issue Age CII are based on age at the time of the initial coverage effective date and will not increase due to age; premium rates for increases in coverage, including the addition of dependents' coverage, if applicable, will be based on the covered person's age at the time of the initial coverage effective date. Rates are subject to change for MetLife's Issue Age CII on a class-wide basis.
